

## **New Features in Medianet version 7.6 ( December 27, 2002)**

1. Shipping labels can now be printed on laser labels if you have queued printing using the Ghostscript module (which is included in the Medianet software).
  2. Minimum days in advance for shipping for items booked via the web catalog can now be controlled separately for each shipping location. (Only applicable for multi-office sites.)
  3. Spot booking paperwork can now be optionally suppressed by medium.
  4. The date summary on the order display now shows the year if it is not the current year.
  5. If you use "reference id" for prints (copies), that field can now be indexed so that it can be searched.
  6. The term "keyword" in Update-Title has been replaced with the term "Subject/curriculum area." The option to add or remove subjects is now "S" at U-Title options. Because of that change, "S" is no longer used for Synopsis at U-Title options; it has been replaced with "Y" as in "sYnopsis."
  7. The dialogue for returning prints that have multiple bookings has been reduced and simplified as follows:
    - Bookings with a future start date are no longer prompted for possible return
    - the "please expedite" message now includes bookings with a "to be shipped" status. This insures the booking shown is the next booking the print is required for.
    - the message "--> Warning: Print is still recorded as Out" and acknowledgement prompt are no longer displayed on subsequent bookings of a print that was recorded as returned for one of its other bookings. Previously the message displayed before Return adjusted the Out status.
- The warning message about attempting to return a print that Medianet does not consider to be out or late has been expanded to highlight a followup action item to staff.
- When returning a print that must be expedited for an upcoming booking, the message now displays the ship date of the next booking instead of the show date.
- The label "Show:" replaces the label "Show first:" when processing individual bookings. The date shown is still the first showdate for the booking.
8. Modify order dates: Change date/extension requests for bookings that cannot be satisfied, and that you do not specifically skip, are now considered refusals and appear on confirmations.
  9. To improve confidentiality for clients, the client code can now be suppressed on packing slips, and shipping and late notices.
  10. Client telephone number now prints in the footer portion of packing slips and late reminder notices.
  11. Client organization/school is now bolded on shipping labels.
  12. Report-Usual-Orders has been added to the Report-Usual suite.
  13. A new report in REport-Usual-Client (53) gives a count of active teachers by school by district.

14. End of year processing is now automatically queued (but you didn't queue it anyway).
15. The subjects in a printed subject index now sort by the subject term by default rather than by the collation code. If you want your subject index to print by collation code, let John know.
16. For a printed catalog there is now an option to automatically truncate long annotations to control catalog size.
17. The number of copies for titles can be suppressed in the web catalog.
18. Web catalog privileges can now be restricted based on audience type.
19. "Change client" is now available to the librarian or school coordinator when that person is logged in to the web catalog under the school number. The coordinator can now more easily book for teachers or maintain teacher passwords.
20. In the web catalog, titles with multiple languages can now be indexed under each language separately.
21. In Re-Book, the showdate default on the order form is now the month and date of the selected booking in the next year, but the date is adjusted to be the same day of the week as the previous year's order. Booking selected from the Re-Book page are now shown on the order form in the same sequence as they were listed on the Re-Book page.
