### **K-5 Digital Content Learning Pathway Course Overview**

#### **Target Audience**

The K-5 Digital Content Learning Pathway is intended for adults working with learners in grades K-5 in the state of Ohio to provide training with specific digital resources and instructional content provided by INFOhio in the areas of literacy development and technology integration.

#### **Prerequisites**

To successfully participate and complete the activities in this Learning Pathway, participants must have experience in two areas:

- Teaching learners in grades K-5.
- Using basic website navigation and technical knowledge of web-based applications such as creating an online account, managing student account information, and selecting settings.

#### **Learning Pathway Description**

The K-5 Digital Content Learning Pathway provides technical and instructional training for digital content available on-demand from INFOhio in an online format at no cost. The training can be self-paced or trainer-led. The K-5 Learning Pathway is made up of 9 individual classes for a total of 19 contact hours. Each class allows time for participants to interact with digital resources and engage in thoughtful reflection throughout the training.

#### **Learning Pathway Course Objectives**

Participants in the K-5 Digital Content Learning Pathway will achieve three objectives:

- Navigate the INFOhio site to discover K-5 resources.
- Develop instructional plans using digital resources to enhance student learning.
- Understand how integrating technology supports early literacy.

Participants will learn how to use the resource and integrate BookFlix into classroom instruction and earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### **World Book Early Learning**

Learn more about World Book Early Learning, an online resource with eBooks, games, videos, audio stories, and pictures for PreK-3. Participants will learn how to navigate the resource and integrate its content into instruction and earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### **Explora for Grades PreK-5**

Learn more about EBSCO's Explora for Grades PreK-5, a database with digital content such as magazine articles, newspapers, videos, and images appropriate for early readers. This class will help participants find content for instruction and learning. After passing a quiz, a certificate for two contact hours is awarded. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### Highlights Library

Learn more about Highlights Library in this two-hour class. This literacy resource provides more than 2,800 eBooks. Participants will learn how to use the resource and integrate it into classroom instruction and will earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### World Book Kids

This class will help educators learn how to navigate the resource to find the best content to integrate into instruction. Learn more about Capstone's PebbleGo Next, provided at no cost to Ohio schools by INFOhio. This resource for students in grades 3-5 includes standards-aligned articles, activities, videos, and games in five databases: Science, Biographies, Social Studies, States, and American Indian History. This class will help educators learn how to use the resource and integrate PebbleGo Next into classroom instruction. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### The World Almanac for Kids Elementary

Learn more about The World Almanac for Kids Elementary, provided at no cost to Ohio schools by INFOhio. This research database for students in grades K-5 includes topics such as science, social studies, math, the arts, biographies, and more. This class will help educators learn how to use the resource and how to integrate The World Almanac for Kids Elementary into classroom instruction. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 Ohio Approved hours)

### Reading on the Screen

Learn more about the differences between reading print and digital text. This class will introduce participants to research on how reading on a screen affects student learning and the strategies and approaches to help students read complex text online for comprehension and synthesis. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for three contact hours. (3 Ohio Approved hours)

## Grades/Evaluation

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This pathway is worth 19 contact hours. Completion of each class is required to earn the full 19 contact hours. Upon completion of all 19 contact hours, participants will receive digital badging for the pathway after passing a final quiz.

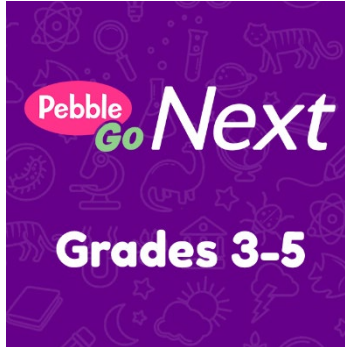

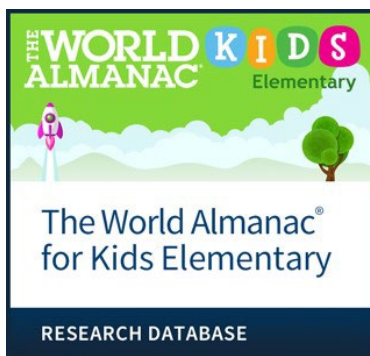
